

Environmental Policy



Consum's Environmental Policy represents the Cooperative's reference framework for reducing its impact on the environment, mainly through the continuous improvement of its environmental management and awareness-raising among stakeholders.

This Policy adopts the principles contained in the Sustainability Policy, especially in relation to the precautionary principle for the conservation of ecosystems and natural resources.



Commitments and environmental awareness raising

Environmental management in the Cooperative will be guided by the following general commitments:

The Cooperative is committed to strict compliance with all **environmental regulations**, as well as to the agreements and strategies that it voluntarily subscribes to for the protection of nature and its resources.

Consum will favour **alliances** with entities specialised in **environmental management and conservation**.

Consum will commit to **demanding, science-based goals** by prioritising **innovative solutions** and **clean technologies**.

Consum's **environmental impact** will be calculated using internationally recognised measurement and reporting tools endorsed by third parties, and the **Carbon Footprint** will be established as a basic tool for measuring and monitoring emissions.

The Cooperative will promote **environmental management** with suppliers and the whole of the **value chain**, in order to reduce the environmental impact of products.

Consum will promote **environmental awareness** among stakeholders seeking their involvement in the improvement of the environment and promoting a true **ecological culture** within the organisation.

✓ Actions for decarbonisation

- Mitigating and, where appropriate, offsetting, all emissions derived from its business activity and value chain.
- Consuming only energy from renewable sources and achieving maximum energy efficiency.
- Optimising the logistics of goods and mobility of people.



Consum aims for the circularity of all its resources by 2030

✓ Circular economy initiatives

- The prevention or, where appropriate, exploitation of all waste generated, especially food waste.
- The consumption of all materials from renewable, recycled and recyclable sources, achieving maximum efficiency in their use, through prevention and ecodesign.
- Responsible use of natural resources.
